AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 29th Day of *June*, 1768,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT having been represented to His Majesty, that several Persons, who have obtained Orders of His Majesty in Council for Grants of Land in His Majesty's Island of *St. John* in North America, have neglected to take out such Orders, or, if taken out, to present them to His Majesty's Governor of *Nova Scotia*, by Means whereof His Majesty's Gracious Intentions, with Respect to the Settlement of that Island, may be defeated, and the Cultivation and Improvement thereof greatly obstructed and retarded; It is therefore this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, of His Majesty's Colony of *Nova Scotia*, do forbear to pass any Grants, under the Seal of that Colony, of any Lots or Parcels of Land in His Majesty's said Island of *St. John*, unless His Majesty's Order in Council, directing the same, shall have been produced to him on or before the first Day of *May*, which shall be in the Year 1769: And that this His Majesty's Order in Council be published in the *London Gazette*, to the End that all Persons concerned may have due Notice thereof.
