HEREAS there were this Day read at the Board, Extracts of Letters from His Mojesty's Ministers at the feveral Courts of Denmark and Sweden, and at Hamburgh, and the Hague, to the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Weymouth, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by which it appears, that the Contagious Distemper amongst the Horned Cattle has broke out, and now rages. with great Violence, in the Dominions of the Kings of Denmark and Sweden; in the Dutchies of Holftein, Mecklenburg, and Cleves; in the Neighbourhood of Hamburgh, and upon the Frontiers of the United Provinces; and that some Symptoms of it had appeared within the United Provinces-His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Consideration, and being fenfible of what Importance it is to His Maj-sty's Subjects, to prevent the said Contagious Distemper from being brought into these Kingdoms, by the Importation of the Hides, Horns, and Hoofs, of such insected Cattle, doth hereby order with the Advice of His tle, doth hereby order, with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the utmost Care be taken, not to permit any Entry to be passed for the Hides of Horned Cattle, either raw or salted, or Horns and Hoofs, which are already, or may hereafter be brought from the Places aferementioned directly, or from any other Port, into any of the Ports of Great-Britain or Ireland, until His Majesty's Pleasure shall be surther sign fied.
