*Vienna, September 14.*

**T**HE Emperor returned hither on Thursday last in perfect Health. On Saturday the Archdutchess his Daughter, and the Archdukes Ferdinand and Maximilian, were inoculated by Dr. Ingelhaus.

*Hague, September 27.* Prince Henry of Prussia took Leave of the Prince of Orange Yesterday Morning, and embarked at Delft, in order to proceed by Water to Bergen-op-Zoom, and from thence to Antwerp. His Royal Highness proposes to visit the remarkable Places in the Austrian Netherlands, and then to return to Berlin.

*Whitehall, October 1.*

The King has been pleased to appoint William Lynch, Esq; His Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Sardinia.

*Whitehall, September 28.*

The King has been pleased to order Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, containing a Grant unto Simon Luttrell, of Luttrellstown in the County of Dublin, Esq; and the Heirs Male of his Body lawfully begotten, the Dignity of a Baron of the said Kingdom of Ireland, by the Name, Stile and Title of Baron Irnham of Luttrellstown in the said County and Kingdom.

*Dublin, September 24.*

Thursday last being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was hoisted on Birmingham Tower: At Noon his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle: The Great Guns at the Salute Bottery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollics from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square in the Barracks: In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

*Navy-Office, September 26, 1768.*

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st of January to the 30th of June, 1768, according to His Majesty's Estab-

lishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payment will begin to be made at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday and Tuesday the 17th and 18th of October next, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, viz. To Captains and their Attorneys, and other Officers appearing themselves, on the Monday; and to Attorneys of Lieutenants, Masters and Surgeons, on the Tuesday, (after which the Lists will be recalled once a Month) that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable unto them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

*East-India House, September 2, 1768.*

The Court of Directors of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies do hereby give Notice,

That a General Court of the said Company will be held at their House in Leadenhall-Street, on Wednesday the 5th of April 1769, for the Election of Twenty-four Directors of the said Company.
