Copenhagen, October 1.

**H**ER Danish Majesty, and the Prince Royal, arrived here on Wednesday last from the Palace of Fredericksburg, and are now settled in that of Christiansburg for the Winter. The Courts of the Queen-Dowager and Queen-Mother are shortly expected.

Hamburgh, October 4. The new French Envoy, the Marquis de Noailles, with his Lady, arrived here Yesterday Noon.

Her Serene Highness the Reigning Dutchess of Mecklenburg Schwerin, with her Sister-in-Law Princess Ulrique, after having past near Two Months at Hamburgh, set out last Saturday from hence on her Return to Schwerin.

His Serene Highness Prince Charles of Hesse Cassel arrived at Altona the 1st Instant from Hannau, and proceeded the next Day on his Journey to Copenhagen, by the Way of Sleswick.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st of January to the 30th of June, 1768, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payment will begin to be made, at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday and Tuesday the 17th and 18th of October next, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, viz. To Captains and their Attorneys, and other Officers appearing themselves, on the Monday; and to Attorneys of Lieutenants, Masters and Surgeons, on the Tuesday, (after which the Lists will be recalled once a Month) that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable unto them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that the several Mails for America, upon this New Arrangement, are to be made up at this Office on Wednesday the 5th of October next, and will continue to be dispatched from hence in the same Manner upon the first Wednesday in every Month.

The Mail for New York will contain the Letters for all the Provinces on the Continent of America, from Virginia Northwards. That for Charles Town will include the Letters for North and South Carolina, Georgia, and East Florida. The Letters for Pensacola and all Parts of West Florida will be forwarded from Jamaica by every Opportunity. The Mail for the West Indies will contain the Letters for Barbadoes, all the Leeward Islands, and Jamaica, from whence the Packet-Boats are, instead of proceeding to Pensacola, to return immediately to Falmouth.
