The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to deliver the Custody of the Privy Seal to the Right Honourable George William Earl of Bristol, the Oath of Keeper of the Privy Seal was this Day administered to him; and his Lordship took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Lisbon, October 22. Their most Faithful Majesties went on Wednesday to Mafra, where it is supposed they will remain eight or nine Days, and then return to Ajuda.

Orders are given to provide the necessary Materials to build a very large and magnificent Palace for the Residence of the Court, in a Place called Campo D'Ourique in this City, which will be a very advantageous Situation, as well from the Elevation of the Ground, which commands a Prospect of the Tagus, as the Purity of the Air. Four Inspectors are appointed to supervise the Work.

His Highness the Prince of Beira has been indisposed with a slight Fever, but is now much better.

St. James's, November 4.

This Day Count Bruhl, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Saxony, had a private Audience of His Majesty, to notify the Elector's having taken the Administration of Government into his own Hands.
