The Sword of State was carried to and from Church by the Right Honourable Nathaniel Clements. After his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys of Small Arms from the Regiments of Foot on Duty, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
