THIS is to give Notice, that her Royal Highness the Young Princess is to be Christened in the Great Council-Chamber in St. James's Palace, on Tuesday next the 6th Instant, about Seven o'Clock in the Evening: And that all Peers, Peeresses, Privy Counsellors and their Wives, and Foreign Ministers and their Wives, who purpose to attend at that Ceremony, are to assemble in the Queen's Presence-Chamber and Drawing Room in the said Palace, between the Hours of Six and Seven the same Evening.

IT having been represented to the King, That his Grace Henry Duke of Newcastle having formerly married the eldest Daughter and Coheir of the late Right Honourable Henry Pelham, Esq; out of high Respect, and Regard, to their Memories, was desirous of His Majesty's Royal Licence and Permission, for him and his Heirs, to take and use the Sir-Name of Pelham; His Majesty has, thereupon, been graciously pleased, by an Instrument under His Signet and Royal Sign Manual, to grant unto the said Duke of Newcastle, and his Heirs, for ever, full Power, Licence, and Authority, to take and use the Sir-Name of Pelham.

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bangor, empowering them to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being vacant by the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God, Dr. John Egerton, late Bishop thereof, to the Episcopal See of Litchfield and Coventry; and likewise a Letter, recommending unto the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God, Dr. John Ewer, Bishop of Landaff, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Bangor.
