THEIR most Faithful Majesties have been for some Days past at Paneas, a Hunting-Seat in the Province of Alentejo.

Hague, December 6. Upon the Prince of Orange's notifying, on Friday last, the Pregnancy of her Royal Highness his Consort, to the principal Colleges of the Republick, Deputations were sent to compliment him; and Publick Prayers were ordered for the Princess's happy Delivery throughout the United Provinces.

Dublin, December 1.

Wednesday last being the Anniversary of the Birth of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower: At Noon there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant on the Occasion: The Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy, throughout the City.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing the said anonymous threatening Letter, and in Putting the same under the Door of the House of Mr. Holcombe at Bridgewater as aforesaid, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in of the said Facts, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
