

Friday the 2d Day of December, in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, 1768, between William Richardson, Plaintiff, Mary Lewis and Stephen Owley, Defendants.

As much as this Court was this present Day informed by Mr. Graham, being of the Plaintiff's Council, that the Plaintiff, on the 19th Day of October 1767, exhibited his Bill in this Court against the Defendants, as by the Six Clerks Certificate now read appears, and took out Process of Subpœna, requiring them to appear to and answer the same; but the Defendant Owley hath not so done; that upon Inquiry at the said Defendant's usual Place of Abode, he is not to be found so as to be served with such Process, but is gone out of the Realm, as to be served with such Process, as by Affidavit doth abscond, to avoid being served therewith, as by Affidavit now read appears: It is thereupon ordered, that the said Defendant do appear to the Plaintiff's Bill on or before the First Day of next Hilary Term.
