Pisa, December 1.

LAST Week the Great Duke went to Florence to see his Children, and returned here the next Day. His Royal Highness went on Saturday to Leghorn to see the Dutch Ships of War that have been some Time there, accepted of a Collation on Board one of them, dined at the Governor's, and returned here the same Evening. His Royal Highness has declared his Intention of remaining here till the End of February; and a Plan has been formed for enlarging the Palace, and to make Dispositions to lodge the Young Princes.

Hamburg, December 16. It has froze here very intensely for these three Days past; and all Navigation to and from the Elbe is now impeded.

Hague, December 20. The Frost, which had set in very hard, and shut up the Inland Navigation, has, all at once, left us; and the Communication is again open.
