**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to One Public Act agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, the Duke of Grafton, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Act, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to,

*An Act to continue an Act, made in the Eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act to continue an Act, made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time; and for allowing the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time.*
