soprest the Government of Pomeren, with the Title of Mare chall de Camp, and the Suedes steem to promife themfelves, that things will be better managed than they have been.

Ditta, May 5. One Friday last there happened a fharp encounter between fome Lunenburgs, and a party fent out from Stades-which alled feveral hours, when the Suedes were forced to retire 3 but the Lunenburgs following them too near their GLNS, the Snedes played fo furionfly upon them, that they lost 50 or 60 Men upon the place, and among them five. Officers, befides those that were wounded. The Suedes likewife fultained confiderable loss on their fice. From Pemeren they write, that the Snedes in Storis have made a fally upon fomk Remder Burg Troops, of whom they killed and made Prisoner's above 200, befides the Cattle they tock.

i Breme'n, May &. On Monday laft arrived the Heer Wile, deputed by the Duke of Hanouer, to affilt at the Conference that is to be held here, by the Ministers of the relt of the Allies, concerning the fiege of Stade. Genetal Wedel is parted hence in great hafte, to that the Troops that are quartered in these parts toge bergant to calle them to march towards Stade : And we heard that a Council of War is appointed to be held this week at Bremervuerde. The Duke of Zell is expected in a day or two at Hirbourg, whole prefeace may toont ibote very much to the haltning the fiege; which is the more defined by the Allies, for that they fay the plate is in no good condition.

Bruffels, May 8. Yelterday abour four a clock in the afternoon, our Army decamped from the Neighborhood of Mons, and paffed the River Haifne, taking their march by Bauay, directly towards the Enemy. It is now eight days fince Bouchain was befieged, by a Body of 10 or 12000 Men; on Tuesday last the Line of Circonvallation was finished; and, it is faid, that on Wednefday-laft the Moft Christian King, who, before had his adaiters between Roffin and Kieurain, removed his Comp-nearer to Quefnoy, to facilitate the fiege of Bouchain. . Yesterday arrived here the Sieur Chriftein, one & the Pleni otentiaries of Spain for the Treaty of Peace at Nimeguen. From Germany they write, that according to all appearance, the Imperial Army will nor ami fe it felf with the fiege of Philipsburg, but rather endeavor to fall into Lorrain. From Cologne they tell us, that the Regiments raifed in that Diocefs by the Bilhop of Ofnabrag are on their march to the pl ce appointed for their Rendezvous.

Disto. We have not received any news from our Atmy fince it marched yefferday in the afternon from Mony with a firm refolution to engage the Enemy if pulible to a Battel, which hath put us here into a great impacience to have a farther account of what has paffed fincesicbeing not 3 of our Miles from Mons to the Enemies Camp; so that it's very probable some acti n may have this day paffed between them, which we are the more apt to believe for that feveral Boors and others in ined this evening from Hall, which is in the way between this place and Mons, affure us, that all this morning they have heard very violent shooting, which we conclude mult have been occasioned by the Engagement of the swb Armies, so that people here run to sheir Devotions, to Fray a happy Success, and are in the gmatelt concers imaginable for the iffue of the Battle they believe the Armies at this prefent engaged in. By our next we thall be able to give you the certainty.
