Lisbon, January 21.

THEIR most Faithful Majesties returned from Salvaterra on the 15th to the Palace of Nossa Senhora d'Ajuda, and embarked again for that Place on the 19th, at half an Hour past Six in the Morning, and landed at Two in the Afternoon the same Day. In their Way thither on the 6th Instant, the Strength of the Current was so great, that the Queen's Barge was obliged to bring-to three Leagues on this Side of Salvaterra, and remain there with her Majesty and the two youngest Princesses on Board till Four o'Clock the next Morning, when the King, who had advanced as far as Salvaterra, but put back, rejoined them, and accompanied them to that Place, where they arrived at Nine. Their Majesties suffered so little from this disagreeable Navigation, that they went a Hunting the same Morning, and appeared at the Opera at Night.

The Princess Dorothea remains at the Palace of Ajuda, being much indisposed, and has been blooded three Times.

Count Scarnafaggi, who has resided here as Minister from the King of Sardinia, had his Audiences of Leave of their most Faithful Majesties and the Rest of the Royal Family, on the 17th Instant, at Aju'a, and will set out in a few Days for Turin.
