In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy, throughout the City: And at the Castle the Ball and the several Entertainments were extremely grand, and conducted with the greatest Regularity; and the Decorations of the Ball and Supper-Room particularly elegant.
