To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

WE your Majesty's most faithful Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Bayliffs, and Citizens of the City of Carlisle, think it incumbent upon us to tender our Duty and Allegiance to your Majesty, particularly at this Time, when divers of our Fellow Subjects, led by a mistaken Zeal for Liberty and the Constitution, break out into Excesses evidently subversive of both. We beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we take no Part with these Sowers of Sedition; that we look upon Discord and Riot as ill Fruits of an Affection universally acknowledged for your Majesty's sacred Person; and that by peaceable Demeanor and a cheerful Submission to the Laws of our Country, we are resolved to approve ourselves Subjects worthy of a King, whom the King of Kings, as a peculiar Manifestation of his Love, has set over us. In Testimony whereof, we have caused our Common Seal of the said City to be affixed hereunto, this Fourteenth Day of April, in the Ninth Year of your Majesty's most auspicious Reign.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Merchants and principal Inhabitants of the Town of Whitehaven, beg Leave to approach your Throne with Hearts filled with the warmest Sentiments of Duty and Gratitude for the many invaluable Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty's mild and auspicious Government; at a Time when Numbers of our Fellow-Subjects (who equally share with us in these Blessings) seem industrious to spread a Spirit of Discontent through the Nation.

When we take a View of your Majesty's whole Administration since your first happy Accession to the Throne, it is a Matter of equal Concern and Attention to us to find there should be a Set of Men so destitute of Loyalty to your Majesty, and of Justice to their Fellow Subjects, as to disturb the Peace and Tranquillity of the Kingdom by lawless Riots and Tumults; a very unsuitable Return for the many Instances of your Majesty's Royal Goodness.

It must be evident to every Person of Thought and Reflection, that these Principles have a Tendency to destroy the beautiful Fabrick of our Government, in which the several Branches of the Constitution are so happily united, and the Religious and Civil Polity so firmly incorporated as to add Stability and Harmony to the whole; and to introduce, in the Place thereof, a horrid Chaos of Blasphemy, Licentiousness, and Confusion: Which Considerations loudly call for the Exertion of every Principle that can animate the Breasts of loyal Subjects, in the De-

ference of your Majesty's sacred Person and Governments, as being, under Heaven, the chief Support of our happy Constitution.
