We beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we take no Part with these Sowers of Sedition; that we look upon Differed and Riot as ill Fruits of an Affection unirefally acknowledged for your Majesty's sacred Per-son; and that by peaceable Demeanor and a chear-fal Submission to the Laws of our Country, we are refolved to approve ourselves Subjects worthy of a King, whom the King of Kings, as a peculiar Manifestation of his Love, has set over us.
