To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Ross, met in Synod at Fortrose.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

AT this Time when a Spirit of Faction and Licentiousness shews itself in so audacious a Manner, to the breaking in upon your Majesty's Republic in your Seat of Government, we your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Ross, think it our Duty to express our grateful Sense of the many Blessings we, in common with our Fellow-Subjects, enjoy under your Majesty's auspicious Reign, and to declare our firm Attachment to your Majesty's Person, Family, and Government,—happy to find this Declaration seconded by the united Voice of the Inhabitants of this Part of your Majesty's Dominions, we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we shall continue to make it our Study, in our Sphere, to support your Majesty's Government, by instilling the Principles of Religion, Loyalty, and Affection, for their King and Country, in the Minds of the People under our Care, and promoting, as far as in us lies, Industry and a peaceable Temper amongst them.

We trust your Majesty will permit us to say, that the Clergy of the Church of Scotland, have, at all Times, since the happy Revolution, shewn themselves steady in the Cause of Liberty.—Religion and Civil Liberty we value as our greatest Blessings, which, having received from our Ancestors, we transmit, safe and entire, to Posterity; and at this Time, we can never think our Rights more effectually secured than under your Majesty's just and mild Administration; which has uniformly tended to maintain the Constitution, as by Law established, and to render the British Nation great and respectable Abroad, and happy and flourishing at Home.

We take this Opportunity of making known to your Majesty our Abhorrence of the late Riots and Tumults in your Capital, as tending, in Reality, to endanger the Liberty of the Subject, by introducing Anarchy and Confusion; impeding the due Execution of the Laws and the Administration of Justice; and leaving the Lives and Properties of your Majesty's loyal Subjects exposed to the Attempts of profligate Men, rendered desperate by Indigence and Disappointment.—No Wonder that such as have been convicted of Impiety and Blasphemy against God, should be found daring enough to offer Insult to their King and the Laws of their Country, and endeavouring to carry on their selfish Designs by all the Methods of Falshood and Defamation;—pretending Dangers that have no Existence, and complaining of Evils of which they themselves are the Authors and Promoters.

May the God of Heaven, by whom Kings reign, still the Tumults of the People, and establish your Majesty's Throne in Righteousness and Peace:—
May your Majesty live long and reign gloriously over

a free and happy People, the Pattern and Guardian of Religion,—the Patron of Learning and Protector of Liberty,—and receive the Fruits of your paternal Care for these Realms in an Increase of public and domestic Happiness; and at length obtain the Crown that fadeth not away, through our Lord Jesus Christ.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Magistrates, Council, and Community of the Borough of Aberbrothock.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Magistrates, Council and Community of the Borough of Aberbrothock, being highly sensible of the Mildness of your Majesty's Government, and the Happiness that we enjoy in common with our Fellow-Subjects, under your auspicious Reign and paternal Protection, cannot but express at this Time, our Abhorrence of the Riots and Disorders, which have of late happened in some Parts of your Majesty's Dominions. We are extremely sorry that these Evils have even so much prevailed near the Seat of Government, where it might have been hoped that the Laws should be best understood and respected.

We beg Leave to assure your Majesty of our Detestation of all tumultuous and illegal Assemblies, and that in our several Capacities, we will do every Thing in our Power to promote the Peace and Prosperity of your Majesty's Reign, and due Obedience to the Laws and Constitution of our Country.

Being fully persuaded of your Majesty's fatherly Care of your People, and your inviolable Attention to maintain the Laws of Britain and the constitutional Rights of your Subjects, we earnestly pray for your Majesty's Person and Government, and that of your illustrious House, and that your Reign may be long and happy.
