Most Gracious Sowereign, A T this Time when a Spirit of Faction and Li-centiousness shews itself in so audacious a Manner, to the breaking in upon your Majesty's Repute in your Seat of Government, we your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Ross, think it our Duty to express our grateful Service of the many Blesfings we, in common with our Fellow-Subjects, enjoy under your Majesty's auspicious Reign, and to declare our firm Attachment to your Majesty's Person, Family, and Government,—happy to find this De-claration seconded by the united Voice of the Inhabirants of this Part of your Majesty's Dominions, we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we shall continue to make it our Study, in our Sphere, to support your Majesty's Government, by instilling the Principles of Religion, Loyalty, and Affection, for their King and Country, in the Minds of the People under our Care, and promoting, as far as in us lies, Industry and a peaceable Temper amongst them.

We trust your Majesty will permit us to say, that the Clergy of the Church of Scotland, have; Times, fince the happy Revolution, shewn to have as sleady in the Caule of Liberty.—Religiai Chal Liberty we value as our greatest Blesfilch, having received from our Ancestors, on the Expence of much Blood and Treatransmit, safe and entire, to Posterity; Fine, we can never think our Rights the production more effectually fecured than under your majesty's just and mild Administration; which has uniformly tended to maintain the Constitution, as by Law established, and to render the British Nation great and respectable Abroad, and happy and

flourishing at Home.
