" In all Counties, Ridings, and Places, where the Militia has not been raised, His Majesty's Lieutenant for every such County and Place, together with any Two or more Deputy Lieutenants; and on the Removal, or in the Absence of His Majesty's Lieutenant, any Three or more Deputy Lieutenants shall meet at some City or Principal Town of the County or Place for which they shall be commissioned, on the Second Tuesday in March in every Year; and if there should happen to be no such Meeting on that Day, then His Majesty's said Lieutenant, or on his Death or Removal, or in his Absence, any Three or more Deputy Lieutenants, shall and may, from Time to Time, as may be necessary and requisite for carrying this Act into Execution, or any of the Purposes hereof, summon, or cause to be summoned, a General Meeting to be holden at the same City or Principal Town on a Day to be fixed by such Summons; of which Day and Place Notice shall be given in some Weekly Paper usually circulated (if any such there be) within the same County or Place, Seven Days at least before the Holding of such Meeting."
