Hamburgh, July 7.

HIS Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester arrived last Tuesday Night at Harbour, in perfect Health, and was saluted by the Cannon of the Castle, where Apartments were ready prepared for the Reception of the Duke and all his Suite.

His Royal Highness received the Compliments of all the Principal Magistrates and Staff-Officers, who had afterwards the Honor to sup at his Table. The next Morning the Corps of Artillery, with Eight Pieces of Cannon, performed their Exercise before his Royal Highness, and at Night there was a Firework played off within the Castle.

The Company of Merchants Adventurers of England residing at Hamburgh sent a Deputation to Harbour, composed of their Deputy-Governor and Two of their Members, to pay their dutiful Respects to his Royal Highness on his safe Arrival in His Majesty's Electoral Dominions. They had the Honor of being presented to the Duke; and these Gentlemen having been commissioned by the Company to offer to the Duke the Freedom of their most ancient Society, his Royal Highness was graciously pleased to accept of it.

Yesterday Morning the Duke of Gloucester arrived in this City, and, on his coming ashore from the Barge, his Royal Highness was received by Two Deputies from the Senate, and by all the Members of the British Company, who had the Honor to kiss his Royal Highness's Hand. General Jahnus, Commandant of this City, the Danish Envoy, and the President of Altona, were likewise attending, to compliment his Royal Highness upon his Landing.

The Duke was conducted into a Salon at the Boom-house, and was pleased to accept of a Collation, which was prepared by Order of the Senate. Upon his Royal Highness's leaving this City he was saluted with Twenty-one Pieces of Cannon.

His Royal Highness went afterwards to Baron Schimmelman, the Danish Envoy's Country-House at Altronsbourg; and after Dinner proceeded through Labock to Travemunde, where his Royal Highness embarked that Evening on Board the Mars, a Danish Ship of War of 50 Guns.

Copenhagen, July 8. His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester landed about a League from this City, at Eleven o'Clock this Morning.

Florence, July 8. The Great Duke and Dutchess returned hither the Day before Yesterday from Porto Ferrajo. His Royal Highness with Count Rosenburg made an Excursion from Leghorn to Pifa for two Days, where the latter still remains to make Dispositions for the Residence of the Court there in the Winter, as the Alterations that are making in the Great Duke's Palace will render it unfit for Use both during the present and ensuing Year; and all those, whose Station obliges them to attend the Court thither, are making Preparations for it.

On the 28th past, the Eve of St. Peter's Day, the Pope, attended by the College of Cardinals, Prelates, and his whole Retinue and Guards, received from the Constable Colonna, as Ambassador Extraordinary from his Sicilian Majesty, the White Hackney, the annual Tribute for the Kingdom of Naples.

Paris, July 8. M. le Comte D'Aguilar, the Spanish Ambassador at this Court, set out last Week for Parma, to receive the Order of St. Januarius,

conferred on him by his Sicilian Majesty; and it is expected he will return here To-morrow.

The Prince of Hesse Rhinsfeldt, who had been here some Time, left this Place last Week on his Return to Germany.
