The Company of Merchants Adventurers of England residing at Hamburgh sent a Deputation to Harbourg, composed of their Deputy-Governor and Two of their Members, to pay their dutiful Respects whis Royal Highness on his safe Arrival in His Mazin's Electoral Dominions. They had the Honor of being presented to the Duke; and these Gentlemen haring been commissioned by the Company to offer me the Duke the Freedom of their most ancient Socety, his Royal Highness was graciously pleased to accept of it.
