Lisbon, July 8.

**T**HEIR most Faithful Majesties and the whole Royal Family are in perfect Health at the Palace of Nossa Senhora D' Ajada; and the 5th Instant, being the Birth-day of the Infant Don Pedro, the King's Brother, was solemnized at Court as an high Festival.

It is said her Royal Highness the Princess of Brazil is again pregnant.

*Berlin, July 15.* On the 13th Instant her Serene Highness the Landgravine of Hesse Darmstadt arrived at Charlottenbourg with the Princess her Daughter, when they were received by the King of Prussia, and his Nephew the Prince Royal, who conducted them to an Assembly her Prussian Majesty gave on that Occasion, to which the Nobility and Foreign Ministers were invited.

On the 14th in the Evening, the Marriage Ceremony between the Prince Royal of Prussia and the Princess Fredericka Louisa of Hesse Darmstadt, was performed in the Chapel in the Palace of Charlottenbourg; after which there was an Assembly and Supper at Court, and the Rejoicings will be continued a Week longer.

*Hague, July 21.* The Prince of Orange, who arrived here on the 11th Instant, in order to assist at the Assembly of the States of Holland, sat out this Day for Loo, where her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange has been arrived some Days. In this Assembly their Noble Mightinesses have desired their Grand Pensionary M Stein to continue to serve them in the same Capacity. This important Employment becomes vacant of Course every five Years, and this is the fifth Time of M. Stein's being invested with it, after having received the Thanks of his Principals for his faithful Services.

Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick, who arrived here at the same Time as the Prince of Orange, leaves this Place on Sunday next on his Return Home: His Highness will make a Visit to the Prince and Princess of Orange at Loo, in his Way to Germany.
