Turin, July 15.

**T**HE Harvest here is very near over. The Corn is remarkably fine, and a very plentiful Crop.

*Florence, July 15.* This Court has fixed its Residence for the Summer at a Palace about half a Mile distant from hence, called Poggio Imperiale, where a Drawing-Room will be kept every Thursday Evening. Their Royal Highnesses come to Town almost every Day to see their Children, and frequently go to the Theatre in the Evening.

St. James's, July 29, 1769.

*It having been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday Night the 11th Instant, about Midnight, some evil-disposed Person or Persons did maliciously put into the Windows of the Dwelling-House of Mr. William Watson, of Kirton in the County of Lincoln, six Guns, charged with large Shot, which entered two separate Rooms; also, that the same Night, or early the next Morning, it is supposed the same Person, having left behind them, upon the Road near Mr. Watson's House, a Bag with large Shot in it, and afterwards shoot into the Dwelling-House of Mr. John Turnard, of Frampton in the said County, with Guns loaded with Pebbles, by which the Windows of two distinct Rooms were broken; for the Apprehension and Conviction of which said Offender or Offenders, Mr. Watson hath offered a Reward of One Hundred Pounds. That on Thursday Morning the 13th Instant, between the Hours of One and Two o'Clock, two Persons fired two Guns, at the same Time, loaded with large Shot, into the Windows of the Dwelling-House of Mr. Robert Barlow, of Boston in the said County, which passed into two separate Rooms; and it is supposed the said Persons left the under-written Paper, which was found the same Morning, near the Place from which the Guns were discharged.*

"Mr. Barlow as you have been one of the Head Injurers concerning hollandfen, and you used the utmost of your power in getting the Rogish Act of Parleyment to take poor's Right from them By force and fraud this is to let you know that except you are determin'd to use the utmost of your power that the poor may ingoy their own wrights and libertyes you may take this for granted that this is but the Binining of Sorows

*The under-written Letter was sent by Post from Spalding Post-Office, and directed to Mr. Robert Barlow, Great-Street, Boston, and received by him on the 23d Day of January, 1767.*

*His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Firing the said Guns, and Writing the said Letters, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplices in the said Facts, (except the Person or Persons who actually wrote the said Letters, or either of them) so that they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.*
