Constantinople, September 4.

LAST Week Halil Beg, Deputy Kehaia Beg, was made Buyuch Imrohor, and the Chief Customer was made Kehaia Beg. The deposed Prince of Moldavia and the deposed Drugoman of the Porte were brought hither on Thursday Evening, and put into the Prison of the Bostangi Bachi.

The Plague is at present more violent here than it has been for some Years past.

Camp at Han Tepefy, August 12. On the 31st of July Cahraman Bashaw came to meet the Vizir on his last Day's March to Han Tepefy. The Moment the Vizir saw him, he flew into a violent Passion, and ordered his Head to be cut off immediately. He defended himself for some Moments in retiring, but he was soon cut down; and his Selikhtar, or Sword-Bearer, seeing his Master in this Situation, drew a Pistol with an Intention to kill the Vizir; but one of his Servants seeing the Motion of his Arm, stepped between, received the Ball in his Head, and dropped at the Vizir's Feet. The Selikhtar was soon cut to Pieces, and both their Heads were exposed under the Tent of the Criminals, with a long Label on that of the Bashaw, setting forth all his Crimes. This Bashaw commanded Two Thousand Albanians at the Action of Chotchyn, and returned with only One Hundred to the Camp.

On the 6th of August the Drugoman of the Porte was deposed. The Moment the Buyuch Imrohor and the new Drugoman arrived, the first was declared Kehaia Beg, and the late Kehaia Beg was deposed upon Account of his Age and Infirmities.

This Day (August 12.) the Kutchuk Imrohor, or Under-Master of the Horse, arrived with the Hat-Sheriff to depose the Vizir, and to declare the Aga of the Janizaries Caimacam; which was done in an Instant, and he took Possession until the new Vizir Moldavangi Bashaw arrives from Chotchyn.

Naples, September 19. Their Sicilian Majesties were to have returned to Naples Yesterday from the Island of Procita, had they not been prevented by contrary Winds, which still continue.

The Ceremony of the Liquefaction of St. Januarius's Blood was performed as usual, this Day, in the Cathedral.

Braffis, October 6. On Sunday last, the 2d Instant, the Ceremony for the Holding a Chapter of the Teutonic Order began here, and finished on Tuesday following, when the Archduke Maximilian was elected Coadjutor to his Royal Highness Prince Charles, Grand Master of that Order.

October 15.

This Day the Count de Scarnafis, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, had Private Audiences of their Royal Highnesses the Duke of Gloucester and the Duke of Cumberland at their respective Houses.

To which he was introduced by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
