Rome, November 4.

**T**HE King of Naples, as Possessor of the Allodial of the Family of Farnese, and by Desire of the King of Spain, has given Orders, that the usual Triumphal Arch should be erected in Campo Vaccino for the solemn Function of the Pope's taking Possession of the Popedom, which will be performed the 19th, if the Arch can be made by that Time, otherwise the Ceremony will be deferred till the 26th.

Naples, November 7. On Friday last their Sicilian Majesties came to Naples, and on Saturday there was a grand Gala and Bacciamano's, it being the Name-Day of his Catholick Majesty. Their Sicilian Majesties went to the Opera at Night, and the Court returned to Portici Yesterday Morning.

Mount Vesuvius seems to threaten another Eruption, having already cast up much inflamed Matter with considerable Explosions.

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, empowering them to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being vacant by the Death of the Right Reverend Father in God, Dr. Robert Lamb, late Bishop thereof. And also a Letter, recommending to the said Dean and Chapter, the Reverend John Hinchliffe, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Peterborough.

Dublin, December 2.

Thursday last being the Anniversary of the Birth of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Caille, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant on the Occasion; the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: In the Evening there was a Play given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and a Ball at the Castle; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.
