Naples, November 21.

THE Court continues at Portici. Their Sicilian Majesties usually come to Naples once or twice a Week for the Opera.

Rome, November 28. According to the Pope's Declaration, the Ceremony of his taking Possession is to be performed on the 26th Instant, in the same Manner as it was practised by his Predecessors, excepting that no Titles are to be inserted in the usual Arch to be erected by the Court of Naples for that Purpose.

On the 14th the Venetian Ambassador had a Public Audience of the Pope.

The Cavalcade, which is to be made on the 26th Instant, is to begin from the Quirinal, and not from the Vatican as usual; by which an Expence of about 10,000 Crowns will be saved.

Florence, November 28. On the 24th the Anniversary of the Great Dutchess's Birth-Day, who has completed 24 Years of Age, was celebrated here, though the Court resides at Pisa; the Nobility and Military Officers in Gala were admitted to kiss the young Archduke's Hand, and in the Evening there were the usual Fireworks, and the Discharge of the Artillery of the Castles.

Stockholm, November 28. Yesterday the Anniversary Chapter of the King's Orders was held as usual, and his Majesty gave the two vacant Blue Ribbons to the Senators Count Bielke and Stockenström: The Commanderies of the North Star were given to the two Senators Walwick and Beckfries, to Count Barck, the Swedish Minister at Vienna, and to M. Adlercrantz, Intendant of the Court.

The Commanderies of the Order of the Sword were given to the two Senators, Count Barck and Snoilski, and to two Major-Generals, Scheffer and Ramsay.

Leghorn, November 30. His Britannick Majesty's Ship Montreal, Phillis Colby, Esq; Commander, which arrived here on the 19th Instant, sailed this Day for Minorca.

This Day M. Alexis Moussin Pouschkin, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperess of Russia, had a Private Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales.

To which he was introduced by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.

St. James's, December 9, 1769.
