Westminster, January 29.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for continuing an Act made in the last Session of Parliament to prohibit, for a further Time, the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch, and also the Extraction of Low Wines and Spirits from Wheat and Wheat Flour.

An Act to continue, for a further Time, an Act made in the Eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to continue and amend an Act, made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time; and for allowing the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time.

Rome, December 30. The Pope, out of a particular Regard for M. Conti, whom he has appointed his Nuncio to the Court of Portugal, has granted to him His two Ships, to carry his Baggage and Family to Lisbon.

The Pope, at the Request of the King of Spain, has granted the Cutting out of the Forest of Terracina a certain Quantity of Trees, proper for Construction of Ships; for which Purpose Monsignore Angeletti has been sent thither to inspect the Work.

Lisbon, January 5. His most Faithful Majesty has been pleased to create the eldest Son of the Marquis of Marialva, Count of Cantanhede.

On the 3d Instant, in the Evening, M. de Mello y Castro, his most Faithful Majesty's Minister at the Court of London, arrived here, in Six Days, on Board the Hampden Pacquet from Falmouth, and the next Morning kissed his Majesty's Hand on being appointed Secretary of State, in the room of M. Francis Xavier de Mendonça Furtado, lately deceased. On the same Day M. Saurine, Minister Plenipotentiary from the United Provinces to this Court, who arrived here on the 29th ult. had his first Audiences of their most Faithful Majesties, and the rest of the Royal Family, at the Palace of Ajuda.

Thursday last being the Day appointed for celebrating Her Majesty's Birth-day, the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower: The Great Guns, at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix, were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, at the Castle, who appeared in extraordinary Splendor to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; before whom an Ode, set to Musick, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies. And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City: And at the Castle the Ball and the several Entertainments were extremely grand, and conducted with the greatest Regularity; and the Decorations of the Ball and Supper-Room particularly elegant.
