HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Blacs Rod, was fent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

Angeletti has been sent thither to inspect the Work.

Libon, January 5. His most Faithful Majesty has been pleased to create the eldest Son of the Mar-

quis of Marialva, Count of Cantanhede.

On the 3d Instant, in the Evening, M. de Mello y Castro, his most Faithful Majesty's Minister at the Court of London, arrived here, in Six Days, on Board the Hampden Pacquet from Falmouth, and the next Morning kissed his Majesty's Hand on being appointed Secretary of State, in the room of M. Francis Xavier de Mendonça Furtado, lately deceased. On the same Day M. Saurine, Minister Plenipotentiary from the United Provinces to this Court, who arrived here on the 29th ult. had his first Audiences of their most Faithful Majesties, and the rest of the Royal Family, at the Palace of Ajuda.
