HIS Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable William Earl of Bristol to be Groom of His Stole, and First Gentleman of His Bed-Chamber.

January 29.

The King has been pleased to present Thomas Edwards, Doctor in Divinity, to the Vicarage of Nun-Eaton in the County of Warwick, and Diocese of Coventry and Litchfield, void by the Death of William Huddersford, the last Incumbent.

Pisa, January 6. On the 1st Instant there was Gala at Court, to compliment the Great Duke and Dutchess on the New Year; many Foreigners were presented at Court that Day by the Ministers of their respective Nations; but there was no Drawing-Room at Court, as usual, as the Great Duke was out of Order.

On the 4th his Royal Highness, being better, set out for Florence, to see the young Princes his Children.

Lisbon, January 20. On the 9th Instant His Britannick Majesty's Frigate the Alarm, Capt. Jervis, arrived in the Tagus from Gibraltar.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
