St. James's, January 19.

HIS Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable William Earl of Bristol to be Groom of His Stole, and First Gentleman of His Bed-Chamber.

January 29.

The King has been pleased to present Thomas Edwards, Doctor in Divinity, to the Vicarage of Nun-Eaton in the County of Warwick, and Diocese of Coventry and Litchfield, void by the Death of William Huddersford, the last Incumbent.

Pisa, January 6. On the 1st Instant there was Gala at Court, to compliment the Great Duke and Dutches on the New Year; many Foreigners were presented at Court that Day by the Ministers of their respective Nations; but there was no Drawing-Room at Court, as usual, as the Great Duke was out of Order.

On the 4th his Royal Highness, being better, set out for Florence, to see the young Princes his Children.

Lisbon, January 20. On the 9th Instant His Britannick Majesty's Frigate the Alarm, Capt. Jervis, arrived in the Tagus from Gibraltar.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on the 17th Day of this Instant January, between the Hours of Nine and Ten o'Clock at Night, the following anonymous threatening Letter was found under the Knock of the Street-Door of the House of Charles Bromwich, of Wapping Old Stairs, Soap-boiler, viz.

" Sir, This comes with my Compliments to you
 " hoping that you are in good health as I am at
 " present I desire that you would send me 4 Pounds
 " to Mr. hodge at the Aple tree for A. B. and I will
 " call for it and if you do not in a short time you
 " shall not be long in the Land of the living for a
 " Sword or Pistol shall make an end of you.
 " Your humble Sarvant A. B. . . .
 " here is the Figure of a Sword pointing at a
 " heart, and here is the Figure of a Pistol point
 " ing at B.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Navy-Office, January 24, 1770.

Whereas by an Act passed the last Session of Parliament Money was granted for paying a Bounty for the Year 1769, of Two Shillings and Six Pence a Day to Fifteen Chaplains, and Two Shillings a Day to Fifteen more Chaplains, who have served longest on board His Majesty's Ships of War; provided it appears, by the Books of the said Ships, that they have been actually borne and mustered thereon for the Space of Four Years

during the late War with France and Spain; and provided likewise, that such Chaplains do not enjoy the Benefit of some Ecclesiastical Living or Preferment, from the Crown or otherwise, of the present annual Value of Fifty Pounds:

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy give Notice to all such Chaplains as are within the aforesaid Description, that they are forthwith to apply to this Office to be admitted to the said Bounty: and at the same Time to deliver a List of the Ships they have served in, together with an Affidavit made before a proper Magistrate, that they do not enjoy the Benefit of any Ecclesiastical Living or Preferment, from the Crown or otherwise, of the present annual Value of Fifty Pounds, in order that Lists may be made out for the Payment of the aforesaid Bounty.
