Stockholm, January 16. Yesterday the House of Nobles, in consequence of the Secret Committee's Proposition, resolved that 25,000 Rixdollars should be granted to each of the Two younger Princes, to defray the Expence of their Travels into Foreign Countries, and that they might stay Abroad Ten Months: That 50,000 Rixdollars should be also granted to the Prince Royal for the same Purpose; but that the Time of their Royal Highnesses setting out should be so contrived that the Three Princes might not be absent at once.

At the same Time it was resolved to grant a yearly Revenue to their Royal Highnesses Prince Charles and Prince Frederick of 189,000 Dollars Copper to each of them, and also 171,000 of the same Dollars for Equipage-money to each; besides which, the States will allow a Sum not exceeding 80,000 Dollars to discharge their Debts for this once.

A Resolution has also passed, to allow her Royal Highness the Princess Sophia Albertina a yearly Revenue of 150,000 Dollars Copper.

Major General Count Wrede Sparre, President of the College of War, is appointed Grand Governor of Stockholm, in the room of the late Baron Luntinghausen; and General Ferlen, the present Marshal of the Diet, is made Velt Marshal of the Swedish Armies.

The Senator Count Teflin, who has passed through so many great Employments in Sweden, died at his Country-Seat the 7th Instant, in the 75th Year of his Age.
