St. James's, February 11.

HIS Majesty was this Day pleased to appoint Richard Morhall the Younger, of Onslow, Esq; to be Sheriff of the County of Salop.

Rome, January 6. The Pope, to enable Monsignor Conti, his Nuncio to the Court of Lisbon, to furnish himself with an Equipage suitable to his Rank and Character, has authorized him to borrow the Sum of 40,000 Crowns of the Bank of S. Spirito, at the Interest of 2½ per Cent. **per Annum**; and he is to set out for Lisbon by Land in the Beginning of February, with the Abbé Antonini, his Auditor.

Last Week died Prince Ghigi, possessed of great Wealth.

Baron St. Odile, the Tuscan Minister, agreeable to the Orders he has received from the Great Duke, is making the necessary Dispositions for removing several of the Capital Statues from the Villa Medici in this City to Florence.

Rome, January 13. The Departure from hence of M. Conti, Nuncio to the Court of Lisbon, is fixed for the Middle of next Month. He carries with him his Brother, Pere Conti, a Friar of the Somaschi's Order, who, by the Pope's express Permission, is to wear (when out of Italy) the Habit of a Secular Priest during his Absence from this Capital.

A few Days ago arrived here the Princess Lubonowsky, Palatine of Breslaw in Poland. The Dutcheis of Bracciano and the Princess Barberini are appointed to attend her.

Prince Xavier of Saxony has presented to the Countess Porta, (Sister to the Marquise Spinucci of Fermo, where his Royal Highness lodges) a Set of Saxon China, valued at about 4000 Crowns.

On the 9th a Courier arrived here from Milan, with the Nomination of Monsignor Litta to the vacant Auditor of Rota for that State.

The King of Spain, in consideration of the singular Services of M. Aspuru, his Minister to the Pope, has nominated him to the considerable vacant Bishoprick of Valencia.

Naples, January 16. Their Sicilian Majesties returned from Bovino on Thursday last; and on Friday there was a grand Gala and Baccio-Manos at the Palace in this Capital, being the Birth-day of his Sicilian Majesty. The Court proposes to pass the Carnival at Caserta, where great Preparations are making for Balls, Masquerades, and other Diversions.

We have had most terrible Storms of late: A French Vessel, laden with Pilchards from England, drove upon the Rocks, and was lost in this Bay near Portici; the Crew (except two Men) and Cargo have been saved. We have heard already of several other Wrecks upon the Coasts of Naples and Sicily: A Ship, coming from Sardinia, with a considerable Sum of Money on board belonging to his Sardinian Majesty, was obliged to cut away her Masts, and drove upon the Island of Ponce in this Neighbourhood. Count Lascaris, the Sardinian Minister at this Court, has dispatched the Consul of his Nation to endeavour to secure the valuable Cargo.

Pisa, January 19. On the 16th Instant the Great Duke, attended by Count Rosenberg, went to Leghorn, to perform the Ceremony of laying the first Stone for a new Lazaretto, which is to be built at

the Distance of about a Mile from the City, for Vessels even on which the Plague may be on board. His Royal Highness dined with the Governor, and returned hither in the Evening.

During the Carnival there is to be a Ball and Supper at Court every Wednesday Evening. At the Great Duke's Table there are about 26 Covers, and at another in an adjoining Hall there are about 80 more: Nobody is admitted but such as are sent to by the Great Chamberlain.
