Constantinople, January 3.

HALLI Bey, Son of Aivaz Pacha Beylerbey of Romelia, upon his Arrival at the Camp at Babadag, was declared Vizir; and Moldovangi Aly Pacha, the deposed Vizir, is sentenced to be exiled to Rhodes.

Turin, February 10. His Sardinian Majesty is this Day much better. He passed the Night very well and it is hoped will soon be quite recovered, though it may be some Days before he will be able to leave his Chamber. His Disorder is a Cold, with violent Rheumatick Pains.

St. James's, February 24.

His Majesty has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honorable Sir Edward Hawke, Knight of the Bath, John Buller, Esq; the Right Honorable Henry Viscount Palmerston of the Kingdom of Ireland, Charles Spencer, Esq; commonly called Lord Charles Spencer, the Right Honorable Wilmot Viscount Lisburne of the Kingdom of Ireland, and Francis Holburne and Charles James Fox, Esquires, to be His Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands, and Territories thereunto respectively belonging.
