**H**IS Majesty having been pleased to deliver the Custody of the Privy Seal to the Right Honourable George Dunk Earl of Halifax, the Oath of Keeper of the Privy Seal was this Day administered to him; and his Lordship took his Place at the Board accordingly.

This Day the Right Honourable Thomas Robinson, Esq; Vice-Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

*Carlton-House, February 24.*

This Day M. de Mello e Carvalho, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Portugal, had a Private Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales.

And afterwards of their Royal Highnesses the Duke of Gloucester and the Duke of Cumberland at their respective Houses.

To all which he was introduced by Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt, Master of the Ceremonies.

*Rome, January 20.* On the 19th Monsignor Aspuru, Minister from Spain, who a few Days before had received Notice that he was nominated for the Bishoprick of Valenza, was struck with a Fit of an Apoplexy, which for some Time deprived him of his Senses, which he had in some Degree recovered at the Departure of the Letters.

A few Days before, M. Almada, the Portuguese Minister, caused an high Mass to be sung in their National Church in this City, which was celebrated by M. Conty, the Pope's Nuncio for the Court of Lisbon; at which Function assisted Cardinal Neri Corsini, Protector of that Crown, the Foreign Ministers, many Prelates, and other Persons of Distinction, who were complimented by M. Almada; and in the Afternoon the Pope also appeared at that Function.

By a formal Notification from the Pope's Auditor, M. Borghen, Auditor and Rector in this City for the German Nation, has been appointed Bishop of Mantua.

Solicitations are making to the Pope, on the Part of the Princes and Bishops of the Empire, for the Reduction of some Festival Days in the Year, in the same Manner as has been granted to the Court of Vienna and other Princes of Italy.

*Naples, January 30.* The Carnival Entertainments began on Thursday last by a masked Ball in the Theatre, and other Apartments fitted up for the Purpose in the new Palace at Caserta. The Foreign Ministers are invited to all the Entertainments, and are allowed to carry with them such of their Countrymen as have been presented at Court.

*Turin, February 10.* The Marquis de Fleury, Minister of State, and Cavaliere d'Onore to her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Savoy, died here on Wednesday last, in his 78th Year. He was formerly in England, had been Preceptor to the Duke of Savoy, and is universally lamented.
