HIS Majesty has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honorable Henry Lord Paget, Baron of Beaufort in the County of Stafford, full Power, Licence, and Authority to take upon him the Name of Paget, and to use and bear the Arms, Crest, and Supporters of Paget; the said Arms, Crest, and Supporters being first duly exemplified to him according to the Law of Arms.

Pursuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information has been sent to this Office, That on the 18th Instant, the Brigantine Prince of Orange, of Ipswich, of the Burthen of about 130 Tons, whereof David Dunlop was Master, bound from Helvoetsluys to Liverpoole, laden with Oats, Iron, and other Goods, was, by the Violence of the Wind and Sea, forced on Shore near Brightelmstone on the Coast of Suffex; that Part of the Cargo was saved; and that it was imagined, if the Weather proved moderate, the Vessel, with the Remainder of the Cargo, would also be saved.

Information has likewise been received at this Office, that the Ship Providence, of Scarborough, of the Burthen of about 300 Tons, whereof William Harrison was Master, bound from Newcastle to London, laden with Coals, did on the same Day, in stormy Weather, strike on a Sand called the Hood, off Caister Lights, near Yarmouth, on the Coast of Norfolk, where she filled with Water and sunk, and, with all her Cargo, is lost.
