Rome, January 27.

THE Empress Queen has enabled M. de la Puebla, the late Bishop of Mantua, to enjoy a Pension of 2000 Crowns per Annum, upon any vacant Ecclesiastical Benefices in the Austrian Lombardy.

Monignor Litta, by the Pope's Approbation, has been appointed Auditor di Ruota for the State of Milan.

On the 21st Instant Monignor Aspuru, the Spanish Minister, was seized with a paralytick Disorder, for which he was blooded three Times; but the Physicians much despair of his Life.

On the 26th Monignor Saint Odile, the Tuscan Minister, had an Audience of the Pope.

On the 27th past, the Family of Monignor Conti, the Pope's Nuncio for the Court of Portugal, set out for Genoa, to embark for Lisbon; and, on the 30th, the Nuncio, after having taken his Leave of the Pope, departed for that Court.

The same Day the Pope held a Consistory, in which he declared Cardinal Don Paul Mendoza President of the Inquisition in the Kingdom of Portugal, whom, in the Consistory of the 18th of December last, he had promoted to that Dignity, though he then reserved the Publication of the Name of the Person promoted. The Pope has now created another Cardinal in the like Manner, reserving also his Nomination in petto. Then he conferred several vacant Bishopricks and Archbishopricks in the Kingdom of Naples, France, and the Spanish Indies.

A printed Allocution, pronounced by the Pope in the said Consistory, is handed about, expressing his extraordinary Concern for the horrible Attempt made in the Person of his Faithful Majesty; having addressed his Prayers to Divine Providence for his long Preservation.

Monignor Lambertini is appointed to carry the Cap to Cardinal Mendoza.

The Empress Queen has sent to Baron St. Odile, the Tuscan Minister, two Hogheads of Tokay Wine, to be presented to the Pope.

Pisa, February 9. A Courier arrived here last Week from Vienna, with the Notice of the Decease of the Archduchess Theresia, the Emperor's Daughter: The Publick Diversions were not interrupted, neither is the Court gone into Mourning on this Occasion.

Leghorn, February 16. One Russian Ship of the Line and two Frigates are arrived here from Mahon, in their Way to the Archipelago.
