Rome, February 10.

THE Pope, to provide against any Scarcity of Corn, has caused all the Granaries in this City, and the Store-Houses of the Castle of St. Angelo, to be filled, and has forbidden at the same Time, under severe Penalties, the Exportation of Oil out of the Ecclesiastical State.

Last Week the Secretary of State received Notice of the Arrival at Cadiz of 700 Jesuits, expelled from the Philippine Islands, Maragaone, Lima, &c. and that Transport Vessels were preparing to send them to the Ecclesiastical State, with the same yearly Allowance that his Catholick Majesty has assigned to those expelled from other Parts of his Dominions.

The Pope, commiserating the Situation of many Monks and Friars, who, having fled from their different Orders, are wandering about the World, has granted an Indulto, by which he absolves them from the Chastisement they had incurred, and with Liberty to enter into any other Order of Clergy they may chuse, provided they present themselves to their respective Superiors within the Term prescribed in the said Indulto.

The Pope, at the Solicitations of the Bishop of Spire, and the Electors of Mayence, Treves, Cologne, and the Bishops of Erpiboli and Fulda, has granted an Indulto to suppress, in their Dioceses, such Festival Days of the Year as are therein expressed. The Dioceses of Munster, Osnaburg, Bamberg, Worms, and Augsborg are also comprehended in the said Indulto, which, accompanied with a Letter from the Secretary of State, has been delivered to the Ministers and Agents of the said Princes and Bishops residing in this City.

Cardinal Bernis, by a Commission from his Court, has requested of the Pope the Dispensation for the Marriage of the Dauphin of France with the Archduchess Mary-Antonia of Austria.

On the 6th Instant, M. Almada, the Portuguese Minister, received a Courier from his Court, with Notice of the Decease, on the 27th past, of Cardinal Mendoza Carvalho, who was lately promoted to that Dignity.

The Pope, on a Representation of Cardinal York, of many Irregularities committed by the Jesuits in the Administration of the Seminary and Publick School at Frascati, has, by a Bull, deprived them of that Administration, and has granted it, (under the Inspection of the Bishop pro tempore) to Secular Priests.

Lisbon, February 16. His most Faithful Majesty has constituted the Archbishop of Evora Inquisitor-General of the Kingdom of Portugal, and it's Dominions, and the Count d'Oeyras, eldest Son of the Minister of that Name, President of the Senate of Lisbon, in the room of M. Paulo de Carvalho.

Madrid, February 23. Orders have been sent from Court for clearing the Snow from the Roads round Burgos, which has detained the Abbé Beggiani, the French Consul, several Days in that Place. We have had a continual Series of dry Weather here, to the great Detriment of the Fruits of the Earth: In the more Southern Provinces Prayers have been offered up for Rain.

Berlin, March 3. Last Wednesday Prince Galitzin, named Envoy from the Empress of Russia to the States-General, set out from hence, with his Lady, for the Hague.
