In whatever unjustifiable Excesses some few misguided Perfons may in this Inftance have been feduced to join, Your Majesty's Subjects in general are too fensible of what they owe both to Your Majesty and to Your illustrious Family, ever to be capable of approaching Your Majesty with any other Sentiments than those of the most entire Respect and Affection; and they understand too well their own true Interests to wish to loosen the Bands of Obedience to the Laws, and of due Subordination to lawful Authority. We are therefore fully perfuaded that Your Majesty's People, as well as Your Parliament, will reject with Difdain every infidious Suggestion of

those ill-defigning Men, who are in Reality undermining the Public Liberty, under the specious Pretence of Zeal for its Preservation; and that Your Majesty's Attention to maintain the Liberties of Your Subjects inviolated, which You effeem Your chief Glory, will upon every Occasion prove the fure Means of Strength to Your Majesty, and secure to You that zealous and effectual Support, which none but a free People can bellow.
