Copenhagen, May 30. In our last we told you of an Engagement between the Swedes and our Fleet, and that after several hours they separated with little loss on either side; on ours, about 20 Men were killed, and 40 wounded. Yesterday in the evening Admiral Tromp failed from hence with 10 brave Men of War, and having a good wind, in few hours joined Admiral Sueten, who with the ships he had with him expected him. This afternoon we are told the King has received Letters from Admiral Tromp, giving an account that he was in sight of the Enemy, and was preparing for an Engagement.

Vienna, June 3. Yesterday his Imperial Majesty returned hither from Newdorf, in order to the giving Audience to several Foreign Ministers here. Three dayes since arrived here the Prince of Newburg from Italy, and yesterday his Imperial Majesty sent one of the Gentlemen of his Chamber to Compliment him upon his arrival. It is said here, That a Conspiracy hath been lately discovered in Transylvania, which was formed against the life of that Duke. The Count Kinsky will part in few dayes in quality of the Emperors Ambassador and Plenipotentiary to Nimeguen.

Hamburg, June 12. The Munster Troops have raised a Battery at Friberg, and all other means are used to prevent the Swedes succoring of Stade. The ships that came from Gostemburg for that purpose, are in the Elbe, and will, it's thought, attempt to put the Men and Provisions they have on Board into the Town; which they would without any great difficulty have done, had the Swinger Schans held out a 2 hours longer. We are assured that the Confederates have now finally resolved to begin the Siege of Staden. We have no further account
