Rome, February 3.

BARON St. Odile has changed his Abode, from the Palace of Villa-Medici to the Great Duke's Palace in Campo Marzo, to make room for Baron Vanfwieten, jun. who is expected here in Quality of Minister Plenipotentiary from the Court of Vienna. Many of the Statues in the Villa Medici, agreeably to the Great Duke of Tuscany's Orders, particularly the Niobe, the little Apollo, and the Venus, have been cased up, and transported to the Border of the Tiber, to be embarked for Leghorn.

Cardinal de Solis is expected here from Spain, to reside at this Court, with the Character of his Catholick Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary and Protector of his Kingdoms.

The Pope, according to the Custom of his Predecessors, has granted a Jubilee for three Weeks, to begin from the 18th of March.

Florence, March 10. On the 4th Instant the Great Duke, attended by the Counts of Rosenberg and Thurns, set out for the Eastward Parts of the Sea-Coast called Cecina, in which Excurfion he proposes to be absent from this Capital about ten Days.

On the 9th a Courier arrived here from Naples, with Dispatches for the Great Duke.
