Navy-Office, April 27, 1770.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half-Pay to Sea Officers, from the 30th of June 1769, to the 31st of December following, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payment will begin to be made at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday and Tuesday the 14th and 15th of next Month, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, viz. To Captains and their Attorneys, and other Officers appearing themselves, on the Monday; and to Attorneys of Lieutenants, Masters and Surgeons, on the Tuesday, (after which the Lists will be recalled once a Month) that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable unto them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shores, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

NORFOLK MILITIA.

Notice is hereby given, that the Two Battalions of Norfolk Militia are to assemble on Monday the 14th Day of May 1770, for Twenty-eight Days, for their Annual Exercise, to be computed from the said 14th Day of May.

And that each Militia-Man, (not labouring under any Infirmary incapacitating him) who shall neglect to attend at the Time and Place appointed, and being thereof convicted, upon Oath before one Justice of the Peace, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Twenty Pounds; and if such Militia-Man shall not immediately pay such Penalty, the Justice of the Peace before whom such Militia-Man shall be so convicted, shall by Warrant commit such Militia-Man to the Common Goal of the County, there to remain, without Bail or Mainprize, for the Space of Six Months, or until he shall have paid the Penalty aforesaid.
