*The Queen's Palace, St. James's Park,  
May 22, 1770.*

**T**HIS Morning, between Eight and Nine o'Clock, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess. Her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, several Lords of His Majesty's most Honorable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, were present.

Her Majesty is, God be praised, as well as can be expected; and the Young Princess is in perfect Health.

This Event was immediately made known by the Firing of the Tower Guns.

*Stockholm, May 1.* The 28th of last Month, the Anniversary of the King of Sweden's Orders was held here with the usual Ceremony; and his Swedish Majesty made the President of the Tribunal at Wismar, Charles Otto Von Hopken, Commander of the North Star, and several other Knights both of the Sword and the North Star.

*Aranjuez, May 3.* His Catholick Majesty returned hither from Cuerva on Saturday last the 28th of April; and this Place now begins to fill, most of the People of Fashion being come from Madrid, either to partake of the Diversions, or enjoy the Pleasantry of the Situation

Mr. Wall is arrived here, on his annual Visit, in perfect Health, from his Country-Seat, where he constantly passes the Rest of the Year.

*Hamburgh, May 11.* His Danish Majesty's Squadron, composed of four Ships of the Line, two Frigates, one Transport, two Fire-Ships, and one Brigantine, sailed from Copenhagen for the Mediterranean on the 2d Instant, and passed the Sound the next Day.

Custom-House, London, May 16, 1770.

Whereas a Warrant is issued for apprehending William Burton, late a Clerk in the Tide-Surveyors Office in the Custom-House of the Port of London, upon Suspicion of having falsel made, forged, and counterfeited a certain Bill, commonly called a Tidesman's Bill, for Payment of Three Pounds to Francis Gendre, with Intent to cheat and defraud His Majesty of the same:

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the said William Burton to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person or Persons that shall apprehend, or cause him to be apprehended, so that he may be brought before any Magistrate of the City of London, to answer the said Offence; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on the 22d of February last, in the Morning, the following threatening Letter was found in the Garden of Mrs. Walton, of Carry Bridge in the County of Lancaster:

" you do not forthwith and Immedately Cause the  
" Body of will<sup>m</sup> Lonfdel to be fet at Liberty I will  
" Cause your Blood to be shed upon the Ground  
" and that with out mercy I am your  
" Humble Sr.v

And that, on the 23d of February last, the following Letter was found at the Door of John Bannister, Innholder, at Colne in the County aforesaid:

" To Ambres wolton at Carrie Bridge  
" Ambras wolton this to Let you now that I  
" perfeve my Last Letter that I seposd to fall in your  
" way Hath miscaried: but I Demmand a catago-  
" rikel anser Immedately whether you will fet the  
" Body of will<sup>m</sup> Lonfdel at Liberty or no: and if  
" you Refuse to Comply with this Order be it nown  
" unto you that you will here no more from me till  
" such times as your Blood be upon your Own  
" head for if such Viltons as you be last<sup>d</sup> to go  
" on in your way it will be past a poor man living  
" upon the Earth

" I would not have you thto think that you fit safe  
" for there is you M<sup>r</sup>. Amb<sup>r</sup>. and another which is  
" called a Justis of peace and there muil be some  
" Corse taken with you both
