**Constantinople, April 18.**  
**O**N the 4th Instant the Captain Pacha was deposed, and Mandal Beg is appointed to succeed him.

On the 13th a Fire broke out at Tophana near Galata, which burned with great Violence for Thirteen Hours. Near Two Thousand Houses are supposed to have been consumed by it.

**Stockholm, May 11.** Yesterday their Swedish Majesties, with Prince Frederick and the Princess Sophia Albertina, left this Town, and went to Dronningholm for the Summer-Season, whither the Prince and Princess Royal propose to go next Week.

**Berlin, May 19.** The King of Prussia is expected here from Potsdam To-morrow Morning, and the next Day the general Reviews will begin; after which his Prussian Majesty will go into Pomerania to make the Reviews in that Province, as usual.

**Hague, May 25.** Prince Frederick of Hesse Cassel has been appointed to inspect the Dutch Cavalry, and will set out To-morrow to review them in their several Quarters.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Wednesday the 2d Day of this Instant May, the Pelbam Cutter, in the Service of His Majesty's Customs, stationed at Beaumaris, being at Anchor at Port Ysly Bay, in the County of Pembroke, was feloniously and piratically attacked by two large Smuggling Cutters, and a large Wherry, the Crew of which fired upon the Officers on Board, and discharged several Guns and Muskets at the said Cutter, which obliged the said Officers, for the Preservation of their Lives, to quit the same; after which the said Crew boarded the said Pelbam Cutter, which has been since found, by the Surveyor of the Customs at St. David's, on Shore between two Rocks, with several Holes in her Bottom, and almost riddled of every Thing: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one

of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
