The Number of dead, on that Occasion, is faid to be in all 712. Among which were Four Monks, Two Abbes, and Twenty-two Perfons of Condition. It does not appear that there are any English among the Number.

The Spanish Ambassador gave a very fine Entertainment on Sunday last; to which were invited about Thee Hundred Perfons. Before Supper there was a Fire-work, and after Supper a Masquerade, which lasted till late the next Day; and at which, it is supposed, there were between Seven and Eight Thousand Persons. Victuals and Drink were given to the Populace; and the Whole was conducted with the greatest Order imaginable.
