On the 28th past, the Pope held a private Confiftory, in which he conferred Ten vacant Bishopricks and Archbishopricks, in the Kingdom of Naples, Venice, Malta, and Spain.

On the 29th Cardinal de Bernis, having fent an Invitation to the College of Cardinals, to the Foreign Ministers, and to the principal Nobility and Pre-lates, entreating their Attendance at the Church of the French Nation, caused a High Mass and Te Deum to be fung for the Marriage of the Dauphin with the Archdutchess Maria Antonia of Austra; at which Twenty feven Cardinals affiited; and in the Afternoon the Pope went privately to vifit that Church.
