P RINCE Iacchi is returned from Sicily to Naples, being appointed Captain General of his Sicilian Majesty's Forces.

Prince Marficio Nuovo is to go from hence to Vienna, as Minister Plenipotentiary, and a Minister of the same Order is expected here soon from Vienna; Count Kaunitz having received his Letters of Recall.

Some Days ago, as her Sicilian Majesty was stepping out of a Boat at Portici, handed by Count Kaunitz and his younger Brother, by some Accident they all fell into the Sea, but were immediately taken up. Very fortunately her Sicilian Majesty has not suffered in the least, either from Cold or Fright.
