Tripoli, May 19.

IN March last died here, intestate, his Danish Majesty's Consul, John Smith, Esq; a Native of Great Britain.

Aranjuez, June 14. M. Conty went to Madrid the Day before Yesterday; and To-day continues his Journey to Portugal. General O'Reilly came here the 11th, after having had a dangerous Passage from the Havannah.

Florence, June 16. A few Days ago M. Mengs, a celebrated Painter, arrived here from Madrid, with Orders from the King of Spain, to draw the Portraits of the Great Duke and Dutchess, and the young Princes.

On the 13th Instant, in the Afternoon, the Nobility of both Sexes presented themselves at Court, to compliment their Royal Highnesses the Great Duke and Dutchess on their Journey to Vienna; after which there was a great Drawing room in the Evening.

The next Day, being the Festival of Corpus Domini, the Great Duke came in State from the Palace in the Country to the Cathedral Church, being attended by his Ministers, the Great Officers of the Court, and the Chamberlains; the Senate and the Nobility walked in the Procession; after which his Royal Highness returned to the Country. The Great Dutchess did not accompany the Great Duke at that Ceremony, being indisposed, on which Account the Departure of the Court (which was fixed for the 15th) is put off till the 18th Instant.

Rome, June 16. Cardinal Rezzonico, Treasurer of the Ecclesiastical Chamber, has reassumed the Treaty for the Purchase of the Villa Negroni, it being reputed the most proper and convenient Place to fix the Looms for the Fabrick of Callico, in Imitation of that of China.

By an Express from Spire, the Chanoine Agent of the Cardinal Hutten received Notice, that the Chapter had elected Count Styrum, Bishop of that Cathedral Church.

The French Agent in this City, by Order of his Court, is soliciting this Government for a Permission to purchase a large Quantity of Corn in this State, for which he offers a high Price, to supply the great Want of it in France.

On the 14th Instant, being the Festival of Corpus Domini, the Pope, attended by the College of Cardinals, the Secular and Regular Clergy, all the Orders of Prelates, and by his Ministers and Guards, made the usual solemn Procession. Prince Xavier of Saxony, the Marchioness Spinucci, and the Countess Camnitz, who are lately arrived here from Naples, were at the Balcony of Count Girau's Palace, to view the Ceremony.

The same Day, on the Report of an Epidemical Sickness reigning in the Levant, a Congregation was held by the Cardinals Lante, Albani, Torrigiani, Caraccioli and Serbelloni, to consult whether it was advisable to open as usual the Fair at Sinigaglia, which, on the 15th, was determined in the Affirmative.

Florence, June 23. On the 17th Instant at Night, the Great Duke and Dutchess, attended by Count and Countess Thurn, and by a very small Retinue, set out for Padua and Venice; from thence the Great Duke is to go to Trieste, to see the two Fri-

gates of which the Emperor has made him a Present, and he is to overtake the Great Dutchess the Day before her Arrival at Vienna.

Turin, June 23. His Sardinian Majesty, and the whole Court, arrived here this Day from the Veneria.

St. James's, July 5.

This Day the Count de Belgioiso, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor and Empress Queen, had a Private Audience of Her Majesty.

To which he was introduced by the Right Honorable Earl De Lawarr, Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty, and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
