IN Pursuance of the Directions of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, Entituled, "An Act to enable the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrants to make out new Writs for the Choice of Members to serve in Parliament, in the Room of such Members as shall die during the recesses of Parliament," I do hereby give Notice, that the Death of Thomas Tracy, Esquire, late Member of Parliament for the County of Gloucester, hath been certified to me in Writing, under the Hands of two Members of Parliament; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown, to make out a new Writ for the Election of a Knight of the Shire to serve in this present Parliament for the said County of Gloucester, in the Room of the said Thomas Tracy, Esquire, deceased, at the End of Fourteen Days after the Insertion of this Notice in the Gazette. The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Nineteenth of this Instant July, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-fifth Day of September next.

Naples, June 19. The Queen of Naples has begun to visit the principal Convents of Nuns in this Metropolis; and has been graciously pleased to allow the Foreign Ministers to attend her Majesty upon these Occasions.

St. James's, July 9, 1770.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that by an Act of Parliament made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for dividing the Haute Huntre, Eight Hundred, or Holland Fen, and certain other commonable Places adjoining thereto, in the Parts of Holland in the County of Lincoln, Commissioners were empowered to divide the said Fen amongst the several Townships, Places, and Persons which had Right of Common and other Interest therein, who did divide the same accordingly; but that divers malicious and evil

mindred Persons, in order to obstruct and hinder the Execution of the said Act, have, in the Night Time, at several different Times, shot into several Dwelling Houses with an Intent to commit Murder, burnt several Houses, Outhouses, Buildings, and Stocks of Hay and Corn, kill'd, wounded, poisoned, and destroyed many Horses, Beasts, and Sheep, and written several threatening and incendiary Letters to many Persons interested in, and whom they think Well-Wishers to, the Division of the said Fen; His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such Felonies, and other atrocious and daring Outrages and Offences, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; provided that no Person or Persons shall be entitled to the above Pardon for any Offences of which they shall have been guilty, that are of a higher Nature than those of which he, she, or they shall so give Information.

To the second Person who shall apply to the said Edward Draper, and make Information before any Magistrate, against any other Person or Persons guilty of any of the above Offences not before informed against, **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.**

To the third Person who shall apply to the said Edward Draper, and make Information before any Magistrate, against any other Person or Persons guilty of any of the above Offences not before informed against, **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.**

And to the fourth Person who shall apply to the said Edward Draper, and make Information before any Magistrate, against any other Person or Persons guilty of any of the above Offences not before informed against, **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.**

N. B. The above Rewards are offered in Lieu of all Rewards formerly promised by the said Edward Draper, or any other Person or Persons, for the Discovery of the Perpetrators of the above Crimes or Offences, or any of them; and further, all such Informers may depend on every reasonable Protection;
