Rome, June 30. On the 24th Instant, M. Ga-brielli, the Venetian Resident to the Court of Naples, having been relieved by M. Cavallo, his Successor, paffed by here on his Return to Venice.

On the 26th in the Evening, Prince Xavier of Saxony had an Audience of Leave of the Pope; to which he was introduced by the two Cardinals John Francis Albani and Pallavicini. On the 27th, his Royal Highness was entertained at Dinner by Car-dinal de Bernis.

The next Day, Count Kaunitz, the late Ambaffador to the Court of Naples from that of Vienna, arrived here, to join his Lady and Family on their Return to Vienna.

On the 28th, the Eve of St. Peter's Festival, the Pope, attended by all his Court, received from the Constable Colonna, as Ambassador Extraordinary on this Occasion from the King of Naples, the White Hackney, the yearly Tribute for the Kingdom of Naples; which Ceremony was performed with the usual Solemnity, in a Cavalcade of the Gentlemen of the College of Cardinals, those of the Foreign Ministers, &c. and in that and the following Evenings the usual Fire-works were played off at the Farnese Palace. A Medal was distributed on this Occasion, which announced the Reconciliation with the Court of Portugal; representing in one Side the Head of the Pope, on the Reverse is the whole Figure of the Pope treading upon En-vy; and embracing a Figure in a royal Drefs, near which is a Dragon holding the Arms of Portugal; the Motto round is, Refulfit Sol; and, at the Bottom, the Word Concordia.

introduced to her, and had the Honour of kiffing her Hand.
