Naples, June 26,

**T**HE Prince of Cattolica, Ambassador from this Court to that of Spain, is lately appointed Master of the Horse to her Sicilian Majesty, in the room of the Prince della Rocca, deceased; and the Duke of St. Elisabetta, the Neapolitan Ambassador at Vienna, is to succeed the Prince of Cattolica at Madrid.

Rome, June 30. On the 24th Instant, M. Gabrielli, the Venetian Resident to the Court of Naples, having been relieved by M. Cavallo, his Successor, passed by here on his Return to Venice.

On the 26th in the Evening, Prince Xavier of Saxony had an Audience of Leave of the Pope; to which he was introduced by the two Cardinals John Francis Albani and Pallavicini. On the 27th, his Royal Highness was entertained at Dinner by Cardinal de Bernis.

The next Day, Count Kaunitz, the late Ambassador to the Court of Naples from that of Vienna, arrived here, to join his Lady and Family on their Return to Vienna.

On the 28th, the Eve of St. Peter's Festival, the Pope, attended by all his Court, received from the Constable Colonna, as Ambassador Extraordinary on this Occasion from the King of Naples, the White Hackney, the yearly Tribute for the Kingdom of Naples; which Ceremony was performed with the usual Solemnity, in a Cavalcade of the Gentlemen of the College of Cardinals, those of the Foreign Ministers, &c. and in that and the following Evenings the usual Fire-works were played off at the Farnese Palace. A Medal was distributed on this Occasion, which announced the Reconciliation with the Court of Portugal; representing in one Side the Head of the Pope, on the Reverse is the whole Figure of the Pope treading upon Envy; and embracing a Figure in a royal Dress, near which is a Dragon holding the Arms of Portugal; the Motto round is, Refulsit Sol; and, at the Bottom, the Word Concordia.

Florence, July 7. On the 5th Instant Count Kaunitz, with his Lady and Family, arrived here from Rome, on their Journey to Vienna.

Vienna, July 7. On Wednesday Evening the Great Duke and Dutchess of Tuscany arrived at Schonbrun in perfect Health. The Court was in grand Gala on the Occasion.

The Emperor and Empress, and all the Royal Family, attended by the Ladies of the Court, Principal Officers of State, &c. went to receive them at the Head of the Stairs. After the Great Dutchess had passed into an inner Room, and was seated on the Left Hand of the Empress, all the Nobility were

introduced to her, and had the Honour of kissing her Hand.

Yesterday Morning all the Ambassadors had private Audiences of their Royal Highnesses, to compliment them on their Arrival.

*Whereas by an Act of Parliament passed in the 9th Year of His present Majesty, relative to the Militia, it is Enacted, that, in all Counties, Ridings, and Places where the Militia has not been raised, His Majesty's Lieutenants for every such County and Place, together with any two or more Deputy Lieutenants, and on the Removal, or in the Absence of His Majesty's Lieutenant, any Three or more Deputy Lieutenants, shall meet at some City or principal Town of the County or Place for which they shall be commissioned, on the second Tuesday in March in every Year; and if there should happen to be no such Meeting on that Day, then His Majesty's said Lieutenant, or on his Death or Removal, or in his Absence, any three or more Deputy Lieutenants shall and may, from Time to Time, as may be necessary and requisite for carrying this Act into Execution, or any of the Purposes hereof, summon, or cause to be summoned a general Meeting to be holden at the same City or principal Town, on a Day to be fixed by such Summons, of which Day and Place Notice shall be given*
